Disabled persons interactive Programme

Rationale: Due to an increasingly urbanised population, many people do not have direct links to farms and food production systems, and as such their understanding of these may be limited.

The 2019 Hawke's Bay A&P Show Disabled Education programme is designed to bridge some of those possible gaps, allowing opportunity for disabled people to get up close with farm animals, food production and rural experiences. The Hawke's Bay A&P Show is a unique opportunity to celebrate agriculture with the community.

The 2019 Special Education Programme is designed to engage both urban and rural people, providing interactive experiences, opportunities to engage with their food sources, thinking and problem-solving opportunities and rural fun.

Inquiry is the dynamic process of being open to wonder and puzzlements and coming to know and understand the world.





Disabled SH W opportunities

The 2019 Hawke's Bay A&P Show Special Education Programme aims to provide the vehicle through which people with disabilities can engage with the Hawke's Bay A&P Show in a meaningful and educational way. It is intended that caregivers and teachers will encourage and support people to participate by focusing a learning opportunity that allows people with disabilities to participate and develop their learning experience of their FREE visit to the Hawke's Bay A&P Show, on Wednesday 23rd October 2019

The show provides opportunities for people to:

-  *Participate in practical learning experiences/workshops*
-  *Build and learn about planting/gardening/growing food*
-  *Learn and participate in food technology*
-  *Learn and engage with Waste minimization/recycling active strategies*
-  *Participate in worm farming*
-  *Present results to a wide audience*
-  *Acknowledge and reward excellence in effort and achievement*
-  *Make sense of information and build new knowledge*



-  *Build understandings about where their food comes from*
-  *Develop empathy for people who live and work on the land*
-  *Express themselves creatively through Art*
-  *Perform on a professional stage to a wide audience*

Areas of Learning

'Get in touch' with farm animals

Animal World: enter into the world of farm animals. Milk Henrietta the cow, feed the pet lambs, have a cuddle with the babies (kids, chickens, puppies, kittens, piglets, calves).

Ultimate K9's: Chelsea Mariner brings her entertaining best mates to the Hawke's Bay A&P show. People can enjoy a world class working dog show followed by an interactive workshop with Chelsea and her Ultimate K9's. Bring your questions!

Fibre fun: engage with the sheep fleeces and learn how it is spun into yard for clothing and wool products. Have a go at spinning fleece with our local experts. Do you have a woollen item you have knitted or crocheted? Enter in the Art section for great prizes!

Fibre science: Join with Scott in the Fleece Marquee to learn about the characteristics that make wool a truly unique and incredible fibre.

Shearing: In the woolshed work with professional shearers and 'have a go'. The shearers will be demonstrating their skill and passion for shearing, students will be able to get on the board and shear their own show sheep!

Sheep-n-show- World Famous in New Zealand! Sheep dogs and shearing as you've never seen it. A comical and informative hands on show.

Police Dogs: The Police dog handlers will be taking interactive sessions at scheduled times. People will hear how these hard-working dogs keep us safe and are cared for.



Special Art Programme

Creative Artwork: Drawing or painting - illustrate this Maori Proverb-

Iti te kopara kai tarere ana I te puhi o te kahika / Small though the bellbird might be, it swings on the topmost twigs of the white pine

***Participants may choose to display this abstractly and with artistic license; think about strength of character, pride & rising above challenges.*

**(Maximum size A3 complete including frame)*

Three-Dimensional Art: build a farm animal which is covered with a distinct design from Aotearoa.

Photography competition: photograph a scene that makes you think about farming and being in the country. This might include machinery, people, items of clothing, landscapes other iconic images

Special Craft Programme:

Fabulous fibre: Any handmade item created by knitting, crochet, felting or other natural fibre.

Wonderful wood: Any item handmade from wood

Other Craft item: this category is open to any hand made item. This might include candles or other items that individuals have made and would like to enter.

Great outdoors

Edible Garden: Get down and dirty with your own edible garden! You can pot up your own garden with edible plants. Make a healthy snack to eat with the help of the local chefs and growers.

Lovely Bugs: Ruud Kleinpaste will be here (Friday only) to share his love and wisdom of insects. Ruud will be based in the Environment Shed and taking workshops during the day.

Worm farm: get involved and feed the worms. Learn about these amazing friends and how you can build your own worm farm at school.



Environment Shed: Hawke's Bay Regional Council present informative and interactive learning on environmental projects they are undertaking. Visitors will learn how they can get involved and develop their environmental skills including specifics about water quality and land/soil erosion prevention, riparian planting and recycling.

Scarecrow competition: Build a scarecrow as a group or individually, bring it along to the Edible Garden for great prizes! (Presentation 10.45am Friday)

Wearable enviroArt: Design and model an original art outfit! Participants are invited to create a wearable piece that re-uses items from the recycling or re-purpose of rubbish. Model their creations on the Show Catwalk in front of an audience. This can be completed as a group or individuals.
