Projects will be judged on Thursday 24thth October, with prizes awarded later that day.

Technology Showcase TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2019

- Late entries will not be accepted unless discussed with A&P Society Event Manager and at their discretion.
- Each entry must be accompanied with a clear description including size required for display, a photo would be helpful.
- All parts of the entry form must be completed, checked and signed off by your teacher.
- Entry is open to any suitable Agricultural project that has been made by a current school student and not previously entered into the Hawke's Bay A&P Show Project Showcase competition.
- This competition is intended to celebrate excellence in agricultural product design & construction
- Teachers as asked to not refer projects for the competition that are not deemed up to an exemplary standard of design and workmanship/construction.
- The Hawke's Bay A&P Society reserves the right not to accept a project for judging if they feel it is not up to a reasonable standard of workmanship, finish or poses a risk to public health and safety.
- Students must construct their projects independently. And sign the entry form stating it is their own work.
- Each project received for judging is to be clearly labelled as per the entry form, including the description and the original design brief.
- the judge's decision is final.
- If a competitor is unable to attend, their project and prize money can be collected by another person but this MUST be prearranged with the organisers.
- All Projects must be collected from the A&P showgrounds on Friday 25th
 October or alternative arrangements must be made for storage for
 collection at a later date.
- The judge may decide to not allocate all prizes if the standard of entries is not acceptable or deemed unworthy of winning. This is at the Judges discretion.
