Agri Futures Module Options

<u>Fencing:</u> Paul VanBeers & six times Golden pliers National Champion Shane Bouskill will be running workshops tailored to students needs; from wire tying techniques to gate hanging – in the Fencing Arena closer to the Golf Range.

<u>Dog Training:</u> Demonstration and workshop with Chelsea Mariner on training working dogs. Starting at 10am onwards

<u>Meat Your Future:</u> Lamb Boning and Knife Care Workshop- Progressive Meats workshop delivered by current cadet, knife hands and business representatives. Learn about knife care and sharpening, different cuts of meat and where they are on the carcass. Handling fresh meat from home kill or hunting, hear about work opportunities at the Progressive Meats plant and their cadet programme.

<u>PC Wool Fleece marquee</u>: the fibre of it! Join Scott to dig deep into the microns, learn about the properties of wool and career pathways with the Carrfields cadet scheme, from 10.30am onwards

EIT: Using technology to help in pest and disease control

Farms are increasingly using technology to help in a whole range of tasks. Pest and disease identification is one of these important tasks.

In this interactive session students will use ipads with microscope attachments to look at a range of insects, fungi and plant material to help spot and identify pests and diseases for their ultimate control.

Water Testing HB: Know What's in Your Water

A demonstration of the field tests that are undertaken regularly to ensure the safety of municipal drinking water. Students will then be given a practical opportunity to test water samples for chlorine content and can match their results with the experts.

Ravensdown: explore the landscape through their Virtual reality equipment and zoom in to their own backyard using the Smart Maps technology.

Ruud Kleinpaste: a face to face with this world-renowned Bug man! His current passion is increasing our Regional Biodiversity by planting natives and allowing our native wildlife to thrive in urban settings.
