KEY DATES

Fri 25 th September	Entries Close. All <u>entry forms</u> must be received at the Hawke's Bay A&P Society Office. Level 2. Kenilworth Road, Hastings by 5.00pm
Fri 16 th October	Final day for delivery of items.
Sun 18 th October	Judging takes place. Selection of garments for the showcase determined. Entrants notified
Mon 19 th October	All entries not selected for the showcase collected from the Hawke's Bay A&P Society Office.
Wed 21 st October 7pm	Design, Make & Model showcase at the Show Launch function. Catwalk parade to be held at the Hawke's Bay A&P Woolshed. Final judging and prizegiving. Media photographs taken. School prize announced, all entries to be taken away at the conclusion of the Parade.

The Hawke's Bay A&P Show is pleased to offer competitors a limited competition to showcase the skill and design acumen of fabric construction and production. To align with the National Wool symposium this special edition Natural Fibre and fleece competition is an opportunity to explore the extraordinary benefits of utilising natural products. The showcase will be presented as part of the Official Show Launch celebrations, offering a wide audience to enjoy the parade.

The intension is to hold the parade on the woolshed stage starting at 6pm. This detail will be confirmed with competitors no later than 1st October.

TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Late entries will not be accepted.
- Entry fee \$5 to be paid to the A&P society upon delivery of the items for judging.
- Categories marked OPEN SECTION (sections 1906 & 1907) are available for any member of the community to enter, including students.
- All other categories (sections 1901 – 1905) are open to any school student only.
- All entry forms must be completed clearly.
- Each item received for judging must have printed entry forms and photos attached.
- Each entry and photographs are to be emailed to designmakeandmodel@gmail.com. Subject line in the email is to be the Category, Entrants Name and School if applicable.
- All entries must be hung on a suitable hanger that will last the duration of the judging. Entries that

cannot be hung must be placed in an appropriate box, not in a bag.

- Entries can only be entered once. Garments must not have been entered into a previous DMM show for Hawke's Bay A&P Society.
- The competition entry item must be modeled as the clear star of the ensemble ie the model must wear a plain black singlet/tshirt (If a bottom half garment is being showcased) or a plain black legging or similar for a top only garment).
- A full ensemble can also be entered.
- The Judges reserve the right not to accept a garment for judging if they feel it is not up to a reasonable standard of workmanship, finish and cleanliness.
- Competitors must construct their garments independently. Garments may only be entered into one section.
- The garment must be entirely made by the competitor- no commercially made garments will be judged.
- All categories will be included dependent on numbers and at judge's discretion and the judges decision is final.
- Prizes may not be awarded if the judges do not feel the entries are of a suitable standard in any category.
- Organisers may combine classes if entry numbers are below 5.
- When a class has less than 3 entries – 1st prize will be reduced to the 2nd prize amount (i.e. No 1st Prize amount will be awarded)
- If a competitor is unable to attend, their garment can be modelled by someone else arranged by the competitor.

Notes for teachers:

- Teachers with students intending to enter the competition must notify the A&P society designmakeandmodel@gmail.com of the approximate numbers in each category no later than 5.00pm Friday 25th September 2020
- Teachers must prejudge at school. If a garment is not up to an acceptable standard, please do not enter the item. No more than 10 entries per class will be accepted per category.
- Funding maybe available to assist competitors where finance is a barrier to entering. This will be assessed by the A&P Society Event Manager. Please ask events@showgroundshb.co.nz



2020 Design Make & Model -Special Wool Edition- Categories

2001: Hat or scarf Section (open to all students)

1st Sash, 2nd – 4th HB Show Ribbon awarded

- *Design/Create a woolen hat or scarf suitable for student to wear. (not baby) You may use commercial patterns.*

2002: Junior Accessory (Years 7, 8 & 9)

1st – 4th HB Show Ribbon awarded

- *Years 7 to 9 – Make either a Bag or a cushion cover. Use natural fibre fabric to construct. Competitors are encouraged to reuse/repurpose existing woolen fabric.*

2003: Intermediate Section (Years 9 & 10)

1st Sash, 2nd – 4th HB Show Ribbon awarded

- *Years 9 & 10 – Create a day wear garment/s using natural fibre fabric, commercial patterns may be used.*

2005: Natural Fibre Open Designer (Open Entry)

1st - 100.00, 2nd - \$75.00, 3rd - \$50.00

1st – 3rd Sash will be awarded

- *Create an original outfit/ensemble consisting of up to two complimenting pieces. Any category of garment can be entered e.g. street wear, day wear, sportswear, evening wear and costumery; for men or women.*
- *The entire ensemble must utilise at least 80% natural fibre. You may utilise recycled fabrics, you may also use crafted elements with natural fibre for example weaving, felting, knitting etc*
- *Commercial patterns that have advanced adaptations may be used for example, set in sleeve altered to a puffed sleeve (not lengthening or shortening hemline). Fabric design and/or combinations showing originality and innovation are also encouraged. Students must present a Design Board/Folio of maximum 3 x A4 pages or equivalent with their entry (to show evidence of the design process, patterns and photographs of the development and progress of their garments).*
- *Items classed as wearable art can be entered into this category, (please note: a separate category for wearable art may be created if entry numbers allow).*

School Prize

- *A Bernina sewing machine or equivalent equipment – awarded to the school with the highest total of points awarded to prize winners. The actual prize will be confirmed on the day of the Parade.*
