## General Terms & Conditions

### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- Entries open 1st August 2020
- Entries received after 30 September 2020 may not be catalogued.
- Late entries received after 11 October 2020 will be charged a 25% late fee.
- Enter online at [equestriantentries.co.nz](http://equestriantentries.co.nz)
- It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure their details of entries are correct.
- The use of prefixes on horses and ponies in the showing classes be those of the breeder.
- All Competitors must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.
- By entering this Show, Competitors must comply with the appropriate animal Legislation the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 (HWSA) and any amendments thereafter.
- Entry in the Show entitles the Hawke's Bay A&P Society to publish an Competitors' name in results and distribute with Competitor Lists.
- The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for doing so.
- Competitors must check their entry carefully. A confirmation of entries will be sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to check the details are correct.
- Once entries are catalogued, changes can be made but will not be reflected in the Catalogue.
- All persons admitted into any premises controlled by the Hawke's Bay A&P Society shall be subject to the orders of the Committee and, in the event of misbehaviour on the part of anyone attending the Show such person may be removed by order of the Society. This applies to any person whose conduct, either personal or as proprietor of a side-show, or exhibit, is a source of annoyance.
- Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by another Association or affiliated organisation of the Royal Agricultural Society, the suspension or disqualification may also be applied by the affiliate organisations.

### SHOW LEVIES & FEES

- Grounds Levy: \$15 per horse/pony
- Judges Levy: \$2.50 per horse/pony
- Admin Fee: \$5 per competitor (non refundable)

### PRIZE MONEY

- All prize money will be paid into a nominated bank account within 30 days (subject to any queries) via Equestrian Entries. Bank accounts must be verified before payments will be made.
- Any disputes regarding prize money must be made no later than 30th November 2020
- The pay out scale is:
  - Class entries 3 & under – 1st place prize money
  - Class entries 4 – 1st & 2nd places prize money
  - Class entries 5 & over – 1st 2nd & 3rd places prize money

### CATALOGUES

- Part One: Showing, Breed Classes, RDA, Pony Club, Pleasures
- Part Two: Dressage, Show Jumping, Show Hunter

### ENTRY - TICKETS & PARKING PASSES

- Wristbands are the official entry into the Showgrounds.
- Once entries close all competitors will be posted wristbands which are to be worn at all times for the duration of the show.
- Competitors with one or two animals will receive 2 wristbands and competitors with three and over animals will receive 3 wristbands.

- Additional two-day entry passes can be purchased during the entry process at the discounted rate of \$20 per adult and \$10 per child (16 years & under).

#### **ACCOMMODATION & STABLING**

- Horse/Pony Stables & Covered Yards - \$40 (2 nights)
- Horse/Pony Open Yards - \$20 (2 nights)
- Stables cannot be guaranteed. No temporary yards are permitted, including taped areas at the truck or float.
- No dangerous horses will be housed on site.
- **HORSES MUST BE WALKED THROUGH ALL SECURITY GATES**
- Motor bikes are permitted inside the security fence in the stables area only and may only be ridden by licensed drivers with helmets. A strict speed limit of 10km/h applies. Passengers are not allowed under any circumstances on single seated bikes. Should the bike have two seats the single passenger must also be wearing a helmet.

#### **CAMPING ON THE SHOWGROUNDS**

- All vehicles issued with Horse Camping passes enter the Horse Vehicle Parking area by Gate C on Elwood Road. No vehicles will be allowed to leave this area and park around the horse stalls.
- Please note that on Friday access after 7am is only from the Otene Road end of Elwood Road not from Karamu Road where a roadblock will be in force for safety.
- Caravan sites with power are available at \$40 per site.
- Non power sites are available at \$20 per site.
- For both sites apply with your entry. All electrical cords plugged into the Hawkes Bay Showgrounds power boxes are required to be certified and have a visible tag showing. Cords will be checked and any that do not show certification tags will be removed.

#### **HEIGHT CERTIFICATES**

- The Measuring Rules of the RAS apply to this Show.
- Height certificates and novice status cards must be carried at all times and presented on demand otherwise the competitor will not be allowed to start. Competitors in any class where a height certificate is required may not leave the ring to obtain a certificate and will forfeit awards if certificate is not shown. Microchips do not exempt riders from carrying a height certificate.

#### **STALLIONS AND COLTS**

- All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature Horses and foals) must be shown in a bit and it is compulsory for all stallions and colts to wear (2) official "S" identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle. The rider and handler must also wear (2) official RAS armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. Badges can be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ and armbands from RAS Head Office.
- Handlers and Riders must wear an approved Hi-vis vest when outside the showing ring which can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

#### **AGE OF RIDERS, HANDLERS, HORSES & PONIES**

- Riders and Handlers age eligibility is determined as at the 1st August and stays in that division/section for the complete show year/season. Proof of age may be required and should be on hand.
- Novice pony stallions must be led or ridden by a rider 14 years & over.
- Open pony stallions must be ridden by a rider 14 – 16 years and led handlers must be 14 years & over.
- Stallions over 148cm must be ridden or led by a rider/handler 17 years & over.
- Horses over 148cm must be ridden by a rider 12 years & over (except for stallions).
- Horses/Ponies under three (3) years of age are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

#### **SCRATCHINGS**

- Application for refunds must include a vet certificate or medical certificate.

- 100% full refund will be paid until close of entry
- 50% refund will be paid
- Competitors are encouraged to do their scratchings via My Entries on Equestrian Entries

#### **SUBSTITUTIONS**

- Substitutions will only be accepted for the same class as the original entry, owned by the same person and the original animal takes no further part at this show.
- Vets certificates are not required.

#### **CLASS CHANGES**

- Transferred entries will be the first to compete in the newly selected class.

#### **ENTRIES DURING THE SHOW**

- Competitors are able to enter additional classes during the show to animals already entered/competing at the show. These entries can be made at the Horse Office or at the Showing section tent.

#### **STARTING TIMES**

- Starting times are approximate only but the show will endeavour to adhere to as closely as possible. When a competitor may have two classes they have entered running simultaneously then they must elect which class they compete in. Our judges and stewards will do their best to work in with everyone to the best of their ability.
- To be read in conjunction with the relevant section conditions and rules and By-Laws of the Royal Agriculture Society of New Zealand.

#### **YELLOW CARD SYSTEM**

- This show supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system which will operate in all sections and will be used for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the show.
- The full working of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website.

#### **CLEAN SPORT TESTING**

- The use of tranquillisers, stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.
- Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of animals is at the person that is responsible's risk. Clean Sport testing will be carried out under the RAS (Incorporated) Clean Sport Judicial Committee (CSJC) procedures and rules.

#### **BIOSECURITY**

- The Hawke's Bay A&P Society supports all appropriate biosecurity regulations. Please check your individual sections for guidelines.

#### **SAFETY HELMETS**

- All riders, including harness drivers, with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes must wear protective headgear which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must work with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in any are of the showgrounds.
- Hats/helmets must conform to one of the current approved safety standards. These standards are subject to change but the latest list can be found at [ras.org.na/equestrian](http://ras.org.na/equestrian).

They must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.

## **PROTESTS**

- All protests must be in writing and may be lodged with the Section Chief Steward/ Section Head one hour from the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50 which shall be returned should the protest be upheld. No protest will be received later than one hour after the ribbons are affixed.

## **HEALTH & SAFETY**

- Competitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments thereafter.
- The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused directly or indirectly to or suffered by an exhibit.
- Each competitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the showgrounds. The Society reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds any animals deemed unruly or dangerous.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings and other structures or other seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk.

## **PRIVACY**

- Entry into the Show entitles the Hawke's Bay A&P Society to publish a competitors' name in the results and distribute with competitor lists.

## **DOGS**

- All non-competing dogs are banned from the Hawke's Bay Showgrounds.

## **TROPHIES & CUPS**

- All recipients of Hawke's Bay A&P Society trophies, cups and other perpetual prizes are required to take prize upon winning.
- To remove the prize from the Showgrounds, the recipient must sign for the prize and provide contact details.
- The prize must be returned clean, engraved and in good condition.
- All trophies must be returned to the Section Head or the Show Office by 1 August the following year. The prize will then be signed back into the care of the Hawke's Bay A&P Society.

## **PREPARATION FOR DEPARTURE**

- Clean out all animal housing to the standard of your Section Head.
- Notify your Section Head of any damage or repairs and maintenance required.
- Remove all rubbish and personal belongings.
- Check with the Section Head prior to departure that your animal housing is satisfactory.
- Check your individual schedules for any specific details related to the section.
- Pay all outstanding fees before departing the Showgrounds.

### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – SHOW JUMPING SECTION

Please read these conditions alongside the Hawke's Bay A&P Society General Conditions (on the Hawke's Bay A&P Show website or email [entries@hawkesbayshow.co.nz](mailto:entries@hawkesbayshow.co.nz) for a copy).

Entries received after 30 September 2020 may not be catalogued.

Late entries received after 11 October 2020 will be charged a 25% late fee.

These apply to jumping events where applicable, including regulations governing Certificates of Height.

### TIME OF EVENTS

Times stated in the Schedule for Jumping Competitions are approximate only, and will be adjusted after entries close according to entries received. The Hawke's Bay Show reserves the right to start an event before the catalogue time.

Overlap - Consideration shall be shown to competitors who are entered in competition that may overlap. Please see the Senior Steward concerned but classes will not be delayed.

In Arena 1, Competitors must jump in the order as drawn and printed in tile Catalogue. All riders must be suitably attired when entering the ring, and competitors will not be allowed in the ring without jackets.

### ESNZ LEVIES

A \$5 Jumping Levy is payable by all horses entered

Horse registered with ESNZ but NOT currently registered for Show Jumping/Show Hunter Must pay the ESNZ Casual Jumping Levy of \$20 per show for all non series classes - Height restrictions apply: 1.10m max for horses and 1.00m max for Ponies.

All classes, except Introductory classes, riders must have a full ESNZ membership, horses must be registered with ESNZ and have a current ESNZ Jumping annual start.

Classes are run under ESNZ Rules and Regulations. For conditions of the series classes please visit [www.nzequestrian.org.nz](http://www.nzequestrian.org.nz)

A horse/pony may only have two starts per day.

If classes have excess entries the classes will be divided and prize money adjusted.

Rules for World Cup Class - Article 273.3.3.2, Art 273.4.4.3, Art 273.2.2.2 Table A competition not against the clock in the first round and against the clock in the second round. Athletes return for the second round in accordance with Art 273.2.2.2 Athletes are classified according to their aggregate penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round.

### FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The FEI requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the Horse must be paramount. Welfare of the horse must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. The following points must be particularly adhered to:

#### 1. General Welfare:

##### a) Good Horse management

Stabling and feeding must be compatible with the best Horse management practices. Clean and good quality hay, feed and water must always be available.

##### b) Training methods

Horses must only undergo training that matches their physical capabilities and level of maturity for their respective disciplines. They must not be subjected to methods which are abusive or cause fear.

##### c) Farriery and tack

Foot care and shoeing must be of a high standard. Tack must be designed and fitted to avoid the risk of pain or injury.

##### d) Transport

During transportation, Horses must be fully protected against injuries and other health risks. Vehicles must be safe, well ventilated, maintained to a high standard, disinfected regularly and driven by competent personnel. Competent handlers must always be available to manage the Horses.

##### e) Transit

All journeys must be planned carefully, and Horses allowed regular rest periods with access to food and water in line with current FEI guidelines.

#### 2. Fitness to compete:

##### a) Fitness and competence

Participation in Competition must be restricted to fit Horses and Athletes of proven competence. Horses must be allowed suitable rest period between training and competitions; additional rest periods should be allowed following travelling.

##### b) Health status

No Horse deemed unfit to compete may compete or continue to compete, veterinary advice must be sought whenever there is any doubt.

##### c) Doping and Medication

Any action or intent of doping and illicit use of medication constitute a serious welfare issue and will not be tolerated.

After any veterinary treatment, sufficient time must be allowed for full recovery before Competition.

##### d) Surgical procedures

Any surgical procedures that threaten a competing Horse's welfare or the safety of other Horses and/or Athletes must

not be allowed.

e) Pregnant/recently foaled mares

Mares must not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or with foal at foot.

f) Misuse of aids

Abuse of a Horse using natural riding aids or artificial aids (e.g. whips, spurs, etc.) will not be tolerated.

3. Events must not prejudice Horse welfare:

a) Competition areas

Horses must be trained and compete on suitable and safe surfaces. All obstacles and competition conditions must be designed with the safety of the Horse in mind.

b) Ground surfaces

All ground surfaces on which Horses walk, train or compete must be designed and maintained to reduce factors that could lead to injury.

c) Extreme weather

Competitions must not take place in extreme weather conditions that may compromise welfare or safety of the Horse. Provision must be made for cooling conditions and equipment for Horses after competing.

d) Stabling at Events

Stables must be safe, hygienic, comfortable, well ventilated and of sufficient size for the type and disposition of the Horse. Washing-down areas and water must always be available.

4. Humane treatment of horses:

a) Veterinary treatment

Veterinary expertise must always be available at an Event. If a Horse is injured or exhausted during a Competition, the Athlete must stop competing and a veterinary evaluation must be performed.

b) Referral centres

Wherever necessary, Horses should be collected by ambulance and transported to the nearest relevant treatment centre for further assessment and therapy. Injured Horses must be given full supportive treatment before being transported.

c) Competition injuries

The incidence of injuries sustained in Competition should be monitored. Ground surface conditions, frequency of Competitions and any other risk factors should be examined carefully to indicate ways to minimise injuries.

d) Euthanasia

If injuries are sufficiently severe a Horse may need to be euthanised on humane grounds by a veterinarian as soon as possible, with the sole aim of minimising suffering.

e) Retirement

Horses must be treated sympathetically and humanely when they retire from Competition.

5. Education:

The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the Competition Horse.
